



## Brotherton Park and Dibbinsdale Local Nature Reserve

This Tree Trail has been produced to give a brief insight into the variety of trees that form part of Brotherton Park, close to Woodslee Cottages. Many of the trees were planted in the 1860's as part of Woodslee's Victorian parkland estate.



Dibbinsdale Local Nature Reserve has a variety of different types of woodland. There is the Victorian parkland of Brotherton Park (as shown in this trail), the wet woodland in the river valley and the ancient woodland on the valley slopes.

Wirral Ranger Service works to maintain the diversity of its woodland here in this Site of Special Scientific Interest. There is further tree information available on CD ROM from the Ranger's Office.
